Our Programs

Mountain Adventure Tours

Our signature summer camp, Mountain Adventure Tours, provides engaging outdoor experiences for children aged 4-13, with a focus on personal responsibility, life skills, and respect for the environment and the communities in which we live.





Explorers Program

In partnership with Far + Wise, the Explorers programs offers after-school outdoor enrichment and education to cohorts of 3rd to 5th grade students from the Wood River Valley, helping them learn and explore the natural world as they progress through childhood into adulthood.





Outdoor Hispanic Leaders Program (OHL)

The Outdoor Hispanic Leadership program offers free after-school enrichment for Wood River Middle School students, with weekly adventures and engaging curriculum designed to foster the personal growth of Hispanic youth and their communities.



Sahm 5th Grade Outdoor Education Program

This 3-day, 2-night outdoor program is offered for free to all 5th graders enrolled in public school and currently serves over six Idaho counties. Students gain confidence, resilience, and a stronger sense of self, all while building meaningful connections with their peers, teachers, and the natural world.

Sprouts Kinderschool

Sprouts Kinderschool provides a creative learning experience for children aged 4-6 year olds, modeled on the Waldorf curriculum.

Key Achievements

In the past year, Idaho BaseCamp continued to expand its programs, reaching more children and communities. Notable achievements include:

27th season of Mountain Adventure Tours

Served 438 children (up 22%) during 60 camp sessions (up 33%) during our summer 2024 MAT season.
Providing \$34,000 of scholarships to support 20 children attending camps.

Expansion of Outdoor Hispanic Leaders Program

Program now includes 26 participants, **an increase of 67%** from the previous year.

Growing partnership with Far + Wise

Our partnership now supports **4 cohorts and 80 children** (increase of 33%) through our Explorers program.

Expansion of our Sahm 5th Grade Program

The continued outreach of our 5th grade program now serves **approximately 500 5th Grade students from 16 schools** across 6 counties in Idaho at Big Lost Campus (0% increase - at facility capacity).

Housing for the community

Through the opening of our employee housing, we have successfully provided **housing for more than 15 individuals** across 4 local non-profits.

Fourth year of Sprouts Kinderschool

The beginning of our fourth year with Sprouts growing our enrollment by 20%.








Financial Summary

The financial summary for the year highlights steady growth in income and expenditures, driven by program expansions and increased participant numbers. Notable financial highlights include:

- Raised almost \$400,000 in operational funds
 - 136 individual donors
 - \circ 11 foundations (4 of which were new to IBC)
- Raised additional \$689,000 in capital campaign funds, bringing our total to 31% of foundational funds toward our \$7.8mm capital campaign
 - 2 foundations
 - 4 individual donors
- IBC fiscal year runs from Sept 1 to Aug 31





* We're investing in the future of IBC by increasing our staff capacity to fundraise. The increased expenses reflect that added investment.

Challenges & Opportunities

Idaho BaseCamp is in the midst of an exciting and dynamic growth phase, marked by the demands and opportunities of programmatic expansion. As we work to meet the increasing needs of our rapidly growing programs, we are focused on enhancing our capacity to deliver impactful experiences through initiatives like Outdoor Hispanic Leaders, Explorers, and 5th Grade programming.

These programs are thriving and offer tremendous potential for further growth, deeper community engagement, and broader impact. By focusing on scaling our infrastructure and resources, we are building a strong foundation to fully realize the vision and transformative potential of these initiatives.
